National Sewing Day Quilts of Valor Block Party Saturday, Feb 3

Quilters and Sewers, please plan to join us at Post 63 on Saturday, Feb 3 as we participate in the National Block Party for Quilts of Valor. Doors will open at 10, we will close up shop at 4. We will combine our fabric and our skills as we create 12" red, white and blue Friendship Star blocks to meet the nation's need for Quilts of Valor. Bring your sewing machine, basic sewing supplies, a mat and rotary cutter if you have them, and good quality red, white or blue fabric you want to use or share. Extension cords and ironing boards will be provided. If you sew but are unsure of your quilting skills, please do not stay away, there will be a local quilt instructor with us the whole day and she will be happy to provide encouragement and guidance!

Because the blocks will be distributed to guilting groups around the country, the fabric requirements are quite specific. White or white on white for the background, red and blue for the accent pieces. For example, if the blue has a small pattern, the recommendation is that the red should be close to a solid. This is where sharing the fabric should come in very handy! Fat quarters and even fat eighths work will for this project. If you are planning to use scraps, pieces as small as 1/4 yard will be more than enough to cut up into squares and rectangles. See the attachment for specific instructions if you want to get a head start! Soup, crackers, cheese and dessert will be provided; please bring anything else you want to eat. Rudolph Allen Larson March 18, 1944 – January 16, 2018



Rudolph Allen Larson was born in Corvallis, Oregon to Maxine and Rudolph Larson in 1944. When he moved to Southern California, Al met Donna and they got married a year later at Lake Tahoe, Nevada. Al joined the Air Force in 1964 and served this country in the Vietnam war and the Pacific theater. He served our country for 5 years before entering the Patrol Academy and joined the California Highway Patrol for 6 years. The entire family moved to Washington and he worked for the Washington State Patrol before joining the Vancouver Police Department two years later. Al proudly worked in Vancouver for 16 years before retiring and becoming a realtor for real estate for five years. He then moved to Meridian, Idaho and worked at Fred Meyers until he retired.

Al frequently volunteered with his wife at the Veterans of Foreign War Post 63. Al enjoyed playing and calling bingo and bartending for the Veterans that visited the Post. He would enjoy eating down at The Curb Restaurant with Donna, golfing, watching the Seahawks and spending time with family
